Text S3: Implied timescales calculation

Examining the behaviors of the implied timescales is one way to check if the model is Markovian [1]. Implied timescales (τ_k) can be calculated as below:

$$\tau_k = -\frac{\tau}{\ln \mu_k(\tau)} \tag{1}$$

where μ_k is an eigenvalue of the transition matrix with the lag time τ . Each implied timescale describes an aggregate transition between subsets of macrostates. If the model is Markovian and Eq. (1) holds, the exponentiation of T should be identical to an MSM constructed with a longer lag time, and the implied timescales will be independent of the lag time.

The implied timescales of our model level off at a lag time of \sim 4 ns, indicating the model is Markovian (Fig. S8b). Thus, we chose a lag time of 6 ns. The dominant macrostates from our model are displayed in Fig. S3.
