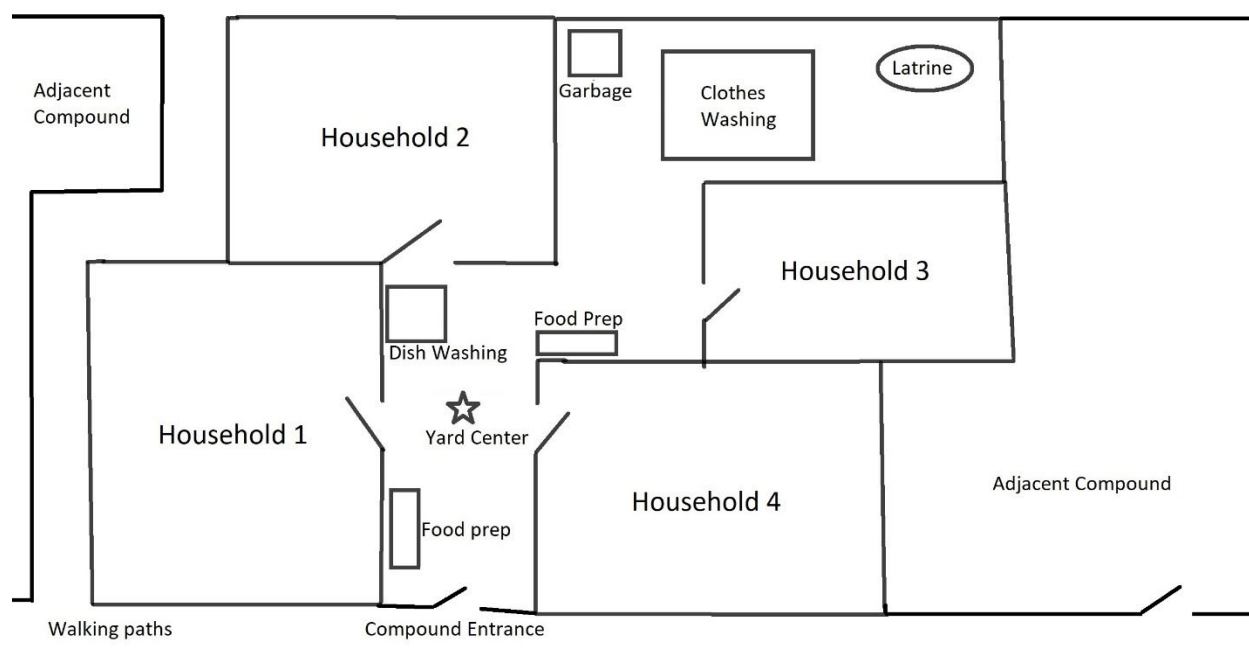


S1 Fig. MapSan compound diagram and examples of intra-compound locations
